PNKF Covid Safety Protocols

The PNKF is committed to offering a safe experience for all. We will observe a comprehensive Covid risk mitigation and safety protocol that has been carefully developed by the Iaidō Committee in consultation with AUSKF and Rain City Fencing Center. It includes measures recommended by the CDC, State health guidance, and local agencies.

Attendance, whether as participant or guest, implies consent and agreement to abide by the safety protocols established for this event. Individuals who fall within any of the categories below should not participate in this event. By attending this event, you certify that you do not fall into any of the following categories as recommended by state or local public health authorities:

- Individuals who currently have experienced any symptoms associated with COVID-19, which include fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, and diarrhea;
- Individuals who have experienced asymptomatic or mild symptoms of COVID-19 and have not cleared at least five full
 days isolation period starting a day after tested positive or symptoms first appeared;
- Individuals who may have been exposed to a confirmed or suspected case of COVID-19 and have not cleared at least five full days quarantine period after the last contact. Quarantine is not necessary if a) you are up to date on COVID-19 vaccines, including booster and additional doses, or b) tested positive for COVID-19 with a viral test within the previous 90 days and recovered.

The PNKF does not require but strongly encourages vaccination. Participants and guests will be screened at the door, are required to wear masks, and must agree to follow the safety protocols outlined in this registration package. Participation is at-will; those who might be at greater risk are advised to consult their medical care provider before registering. Withdrawal from the seminar or shinsa for reasons of illness shall be honored without penalty and all fees returned.

The PNKF Iaidō Committee thanks everyone for cooperating to ensure this event is as safe as possible.

Attendance

- It is unlikely, but registration <u>may</u> be restricted to ensure physical distancing; if that occurs, preference will be given to test candidates. We will confirm registrations as soon as possible.
- Temperature checks <u>may</u> be conducted at the door; everyone must sign the AUSKF Covid Questionnaire daily
- Pre-registration is required; walk-ins <u>not</u> permitted
- Attendees must be members of AUSKF or FIK affiliate
- Spectators are allowed but will be screened and must sign the PNKF waiver and AUSKF Covid Questionnaire
- Provide your own equipment, hand sanitizer, mask, and <u>named</u> water bottle
- No penalty assessed if withdrawing from the seminar, taikai, or shinsa for reason of illness, and all fees will be returned.

Sanitation

- All participants required to wear face masks that cover their nose and mouth inside the event venue
- Practice hand hygiene, especially if wearing tabi (unless medically necessary, tabi prohibited during shinsa and taikai)

Requirements

Candidates must attend the seminar if taking an laidō exam. Seminar instructors will detail elements of the art and technique that will be assessed during tests. Contact the event coordinator in the event of special circumstances, and we will try to accommodate.

Candidates must be current members of AUSKF or obtain written permission from their national Kendo Federation. If not AUSKF registered prior to the event, you are NOT ELIGIBLE to test. The applicant's AUSKF Membership Number must be included on the application form. *If a member of a regional federation other than the PNKF*, your application must be approved by your federation president. *If applying from outside AUSKF from an FIK affiliate*, your application must be approved by the AUSKF vice president prior to the exam. The earlier these applications are received, the better.

- a. **Essays**, if required, must be computer-processed or typewritten and printed on the "laido Shinsa Written Exam Form". Please refer to the "laido Shinsa Written Test Questions".
- b. If **special considerations** need to be made, such as for injury or medical limitations, please include a note of explanation so that this information may be given to the Examination Board. Doctor's notes are not required.

Application Deadlines (Absolutely NO late entries!)

Online application by Saturday, September 17. Fees must be received no later than Saturday, September 24.

<u>All fees and documentation must be received by the deadline</u>. Get yours in early to make sure there are no problems with your application. Email is not a substitute for the submission of fees and hard copy by the deadline.

Cancellations and refunds: Requests for Shinsa cancellations, except in case of illness, must be received no later than Saturday, October 1. Cancellations received after this date will have only the certificate fee returned. In the case of illness, all fees will be returned. Please note that if an applicant does not pass the examination, only the certificate fee will be returned. If an applicant does not attend the Shinsa without proper notification, the Shinsa fee is forfeited, and only the certificate fee is returned. If special circumstances occur, please notify the Event Coordinator as soon as possible.

PNKF laidō Shinsa Requirements (edited for Kyu to 3 Dan)

Adopted by the PNKF Board of Directors January 12, 2019

- Age is the minimum age as of the date of the Examination.
- Number of months of practice in rank is the minimum number of months.
- Highest rank for first test as indicated below, in principle no jumping ranks after first test.
- A lower kyu rank can be awarded if the candidate does not meet passing criteria for their first rank test, except in case of Junior 6 kyu or Adult 3 kyu, which are minimum starting ranks.
- All swords shall meet safety criteria as defined by the exam officials.

Mudansha Ranks: Juniors (age 10 and below)

Performed with Mogitō or bokutō (bokken), use of shinken not permitted.

6 Kyu: 8 years of age; 6 months practice

Perform AJKF Seitei Iai reihō and kata #1 and #2

5 Kyu: 9 years of age; 12 months practice (or 6 months in previous rank)

Perform AJKF Seitei lai reihō and kata #1 thru #3

4 Kyu: 10 years of age; 12 months practice (or 6 months in previous rank)

Perform AJKF Seitei lai reihō and kata #1 thru #4

Mudansha Ranks: Adults (age 18 and up), Juniors (age 11-17)

- Adult first test can be either 3 kyu or 2 kyu, however the highest rank adult first test is 2 kyu.
- First rank tests above 2 kyu require approval by the PNKF President.
- Mogitō required, use of shinken (sharp sword) not permitted.

3 Kyu: 11 years of age; 12 months practice (or 6 months in previous rank)

Perform AJKF Seitei lai reihō and five (5) AJKF Seitei lai from kata #1 thru #10

2 Kyu: 12 years of age; one year total practice (or 6 months in previous rank)

Perform AJKF Seitei lai reihō and five (5) AJKF Seitei lai from kata #1 thru #10

1 Kyu: 13 years of age; 6 months in previous rank

Perform AJKF Seitei lai reihō and five (5) AJKF Seitei lai from kata #1 thru #12

Yudansha Ranks: Adults (age 18 and up), Juniors (age 14-17)

• Mogitō required, use of shinken only with permission of shinsa panel chair.

Notes for PNKF laidō Shinsa:

- The PNKF laido Committee Chair, with the consent of the Advisor, will determine which Seitei Kata will be required.
- Age is the minimum age as of the date of the Promotional Examination. If the applicant's birthday is within one (1) month of the Promotional Examination, the applicant will be eligible.
- Number of months of practice or months in rank is the minimum number of months. The amount of time in the previous rank must be within 15 days of the required time.
- Highest rank for first test as indicated above, in principle no jumping ranks after the first test.
- A lower kyu rank can be awarded if the candidate does not meet passing criteria for their first rank test, except in the case of Junior 6 kyu or adult 3 kyu, which are minimum starting ranks.
- All swords shall meet safety criteria as defined by the exam officials.
- The written exam essay must be submitted in English. Computer processed or typed submissions are preferred. If handwritten, make sure submissions are clearly legible; answers that are too difficult to read may be rejected.
- Written examination questions and instructions will match the most current laidō shinsa information published by AUSKF.
- Candidates shall submit their written answers together with their test fees by the deadline.
- The written examination for 1 Kyu-3 Dan will be graded as either pass or fail by an appointed representative of the PNKF laidō Committee Chair. Essays for 4 and 5 Dan will be graded by an AUSKF representative.

Iaidō Shinsa Written Test Questions

Answer two questions from the group of questions for the rank for which you are testing.

First Kyu Candidates

- 1. List the names of the twelve All Japan Kendo Federation laido kata. Include a short English translation for each.
- 2. Describe the proper way of gripping the katana when cutting.
- 3. Why are you studying laido? What do you hope to accomplish?

Shodan Candidates

- 1. Tsuki (thrusts) occur in five of the ZNKR lai kata. Name these katas, and identify the target areas.
- 2. Draw a simple diagram of a katana, label as many parts as you can.
- 3. What is kirioroshi? Describe its use in one All Japan Kendo Federation laido kata.

Nidan Candidates

- 1. Discuss zanshin. Describe its use in one All Japan Kendo Federation laido kata.
- 2. A katana blade has three sections or areas along its length; describe the location and use of each.
- 3. What is meant by the term Iai-goshi? Describe its use in one All Japan Kendo Federation Iaido kata.

Sandan Candidates

- 1. What is metsuke? Describe its use in one All Japan Kendo Federation laido kata.
- 2. Describe how to clean a sword (shinken and/or iaito).
- 3. Discuss jo-ha-kyu.

Yondan Candidates

- 1. Define hasuji and discuss its importance in laido.
- 2. What is saya biki? Why do we do it?
- 3. Explain fudo-shin.

Godan Candidates

- 1. Describe the hara (tanden) and explain its importance for laido.
- 2. What is meant by saya-no-uchi? How does it apply to AJKF laido?
- 3. What is important when teaching laido to beginners?

Guidelines for PNKF Iaido Shinsa up to 3 Dan Written Test Questions

Essays are expected: don't submit mere definitions. We're looking for discussion in your own words, evidence of personal research, and indication of increasing breadth and depth of understanding.

Suggested Essay Lengths

- 1 Kyu No less than 5-6 sentences and no more than one -third page, for each answer
- 1 Dan No less than 6-8 sentences and no more than one-half page, for each answer
- 2 Dan No less than 8-10 sentences and no more than one-half page, for each answer
- 3 Dan No less than 10-15 sentences and no more than two-thirds page, for each answer

Basic Sword Safety Checklist

Pacific Northwest Kendo Federation - PNKF Iaido Committee

21 October 2019 (revised 2/12/2022)

Introduction

Keeping your equipment clean and in good condition is a pleasure and a necessity. It is indicative of an advanced practitioner's respect towards his or her tools, and enhances everyone's safety and enjoyment of practice. In recent years, sword checks have become standard at all regional and national events, and are normal procedure for participants up to 5 Dan (6 Dan and higher rank instructors – though exempt from this requirement – are welcome to submit their swords for inspection voluntarily) at all PNKF sponsored and hosted laido events. *laidoka* are responsible for maintaining their equipment to ensure personal safety for themselves and others in their vicinity. When in doubt, consult your instructor or another qualified person, and be mindful that some sword repairs should only be undertaken by professionals.

Points of inspection

There are several items that will be checked during sword inspection. These critical safety items are listed in order of importance, and any deficiencies should be addressed immediately.

Essential Points for Inspection (used at PNKF Sword Checks)

- 1. Is the sword Japanese-made as required by AUSKF and FIK rules?

 This rule was made to address issues with non-Japanese swords that proved more susceptible to breakage in past years, posing alarmingly dangerous conditions to others.
- 2. Is the blade in good condition, free of serious warpage, chips or dents?
- 3. Are the *mekugi* (retaining pin(s)) and *mekugi-ana* (retaining pin hole(s)) in good condition? The bamboo used for ohashi or "chopsticks" is <u>not suitable</u> for mekugi. There are many varieties of bamboo that are soft and weak. Good mekugi are made of a special aged and smoked bamboo called *susudake* す 寸 竹. Mekugi are carved from the outer part of the bamboo with the tightest grain. This is the hardest part of the bamboo. Other woods are not good substitutes for bamboo. Wood mekugi tend to snap, while bamboo tends to deform. Water buffalo mekugi are only suitable for *shirasaya* (holding scabbards), are purely decorative, and are <u>not</u> suitable for working swords. *PNKF inspections of shinken may request that you remove the mekugi for visual inspection of this essential component.*
- 4. Are the *tsuba* (guard) and *habaki* (collar) tight and free of noise or slippage when the sword is handled? Excessive movement puts extra stress upon the mekugi, posing an unnecessary risk to yourself and others.

Other Considerations: Primarily the Responsibility of the Practitioner

- 5. Is the koiguchi (mouth of the scabbard)-habaki (blade collar) fit tight enough to prevent falling out of the blade?
- 6. Is the saya (scabbard) in good repair and free of any cracks?
- 7. Is the *nakago* (tang) fit snugly within the tsuka (handle)
- 8. Is the tsuka-ito (handle wrap) in sufficiently good and tight condition to ensure safe practice?

Thank you for attending to your sword's safety. If you need assistance with basic repairs, PNKF laido Committee members may be able to help. When in doubt, please ask. We want everyone to enjoy laido practice safely.
